PARISH NEWS

Hello Everyone

The Annual Parish meeting was held prior to the council meeting on the 1st April. The Chair's report, given at the Annual Parish Meeting, was as follows:

"It has been an eventful year this year with the parish having appeared on National TV twice. On the first occasion it was due to the tragic coach crash with two fatalities on board. I understand that the Police investigation is still on-going due to the seriousness of the accident and the severity of the consequences. The driver of the coach remains on bail pending any charges. I noticed on Monday that a man with a pedometer was marking the road with what appeared to be distance indications from the crash site so hopefully things are progressing.

I think it right to mention that the feedback I have received regarding the help and assistance given to the passengers by the local residents and the facilities provided by Metherall Gard have been extremely positive and on behalf of the parish council, I would like to thank all of those who took part.

The second occasion was the huge presence of armed response officers in the parish due to an incident in June involving a firearm. Unfortunately, I was in Derriford Hospital at the time and could only get information via the TV although I was informed by a nurse that the man arrested was in the ward below with a police guard and so I made no attempt to see him. At the end of the month Darrell Weaver received a custodial sentence for illegal possession of firearms.

Now I would move onto council business which I have restricted to the two major items that have been resolved due to the fullness of tonight's agenda and to keep within the allotted five minutes. The lane alongside the school has at long last been sold and the council is no longer responsible for its upkeep and is devoid of any further responsibilities and although the cost of disposal was more than desired the long term saving will be considerably greater, which will be of great benefit to the council as will the loss of time the council spent debating it. I would like to extend our thanks to the School Staff, Governors and Councillor Candy for their considerable input to achieve this resolution.

PARISH NEWS continued....

The "Village Green" is another long running situation that has now finally been resolved by the council accepting a pepper corn rental agreement with Cornwall Council and taking on responsibility for running and maintaining the "Green", the cost of which is still an on-going item. An agreement has been reached with Cornwall Council that they would meet half our legal costs which were mainly incurred due to the misguiding information it provided at the onset.

I have restricted my report to items mentioned as most of the other business is still on-going and will be for future debate. I would, however, take this opportunity to thank our Clerk for all the hard work she has put into what is by no means an easy job. Thank you, Lynnette. My thanks go also to my fellow councillors and to Councillor Candy for your hard work and support over the last year."

The parish council has begun the annual audit process and due to the number of documents that need to be displayed as part of the process, the clerk will be using the new notice board at Sandplace to display them.

The parish council has recently been made aware that new signage for Morview Road has still not been erected. Cornwall Councillor Jim Candy has agreed to support the parish council so that this matter can be brought to a positive conclusion.

Grass cutting and maintenance of the flowerbed at Widegates "Village Green" should begin very soon and the council would take this opportunity to request that dogs mess is picked up and disposed of appropriately so that the area is able to be used safely by all members of the community.

The Annual Council Meeting will be held at 7.00 pm immediately prior to the usual council meeting on the 6th May. Members of the community are very welcome to attend.

“My family know what I want, so I needn’t bother with a will”

Well, actually, that’s totally irrelevant. If you don’t have a Will, the State has a Will for you, and that Will is named, ‘The Law of Intestacy’. It won’t take account of today’s complex family structures, but it will allow the treasury to take far more tax than is necessary. 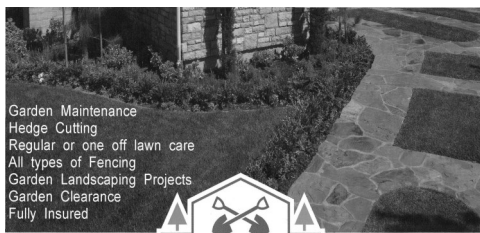

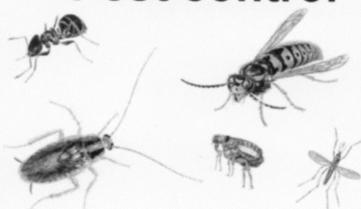

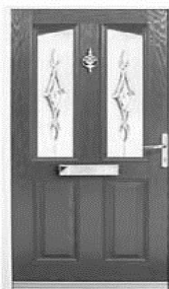
