

Even upon his retirement from the Parish Council, Mr Matthews has offered his time to ensure that the weekly checks of the Green are carried out as required by the council's insurance company. He continues to be seen carrying out litter picks within the village and still ensures that the hall is open and set up ready for the council meetings.

In recognition of his commitment, members of the Parish Council recently presented him with a token of appreciation at one of the Bingo evenings that he is involved with at the village hall. 
