PARISH NEWS

Hello Everyone

The Parish Council agreed at its meeting held on the 5th October to hold a public consultation to enable members of the public to view and pass comment on the research provided by its clerk. The research suggests that the information initially received about one of the gentlemen named on the War Memorial is not related to him and refers to another gentleman entirely. The consultation period began on the 11th October and will end on the 24th November, 2016. Any person wishing to view the clerk's research should contact her so that an appointment can be made.

In addition, the council also agreed that the clerk should continue her research as there is a tiny chance that the gentlemen concerned has surviving family currently living abroad. Once the clerk has completed this research and the consultation period is complete, the council will consider a request received from the local family to have the gentleman's name altered on the War Memorial.

The council is looking to collate information about incidents involving vehicles travelling at speed through either Morval or Nomansland. Any person with any information on such incidents can contact the clerk and of course, the Police so that they become part of official figures.

The Parish Council is aware that rubble has been dumped on the verge alongside the main road through Widegates. Cornwall Councillor Candy will take steps to have it removed.

A positive letter has been received from Hastoe that indicated that Cormac is being commissioned to carry out all of the outstanding work required at Shortacross View. The Parish Council will continue to work towards bringing this matter to a positive conclusion.

St. Martin's Parish Council has agreed not to continue with having a shelter erected on the opposite side of the road from Bindown Stores at Nomasland as unfortunately, it was unable to have the shelter facing the way that it wished. Morval Parish Council will go ahead therefore, and

have the bus stop on that side of the road moved to a safer location whilst having a shelter erected at the bus stop on the Bindown Stores side of the road.

WIDEGATES GARDEN CLUB

September meeting was a talk and slide show on bulbs through the year given by Mark Wash from Trecanna Nursery. The slides showed some beautiful blooms flowering every month of the year from snowdrops to colchicums. We think of all the different bulbs that flower in the spring but have you thought of the colchicums that flower in the late autumn, cyclamen that flower from autumn to spring; winter aconites, crocus, anemonies and their species that add colour to your garden during a dull time.

Now is the time to get your spring flowering bulbs planted; wait until November for your tulips as they have a habit of rotting if planted too early. If planting in pots remember to put plenty of grit in the compost to aid drainage. Most bulbs are quite happy to stay in a pot for two years then plant them in the garden, I do before they die down, because they suffer from basal rot if the pot is too wet. Have you thought of tier planting in pots biggest bulbs on the bottom layer and crocuses on the top so that you have a succession of flowers in one pot, give it a go lovely results.


