PARISH NEWS

Hello Everyone

It is with great sadness that the Parish Council received the news at its November meeting from Dr. Meriel Kitson that she was retiring from her role as Editor of The Outlook magazine in 2017. The Council offers its thanks to her for the time and commitment that she has given to ensuring that the magazine is produced and delivered to homes within the parish. Equally, it wishes to thank Mr Richard Kneebone, who is also retiring, for printing the magazine.

The Council will be considering the findings of the clerk, comments received during its public consultation period and advice provided by organisations who specialise in War Memorial matters at its meeting on the 7th December with a view to reaching a decision about the request received to have the spelling of a name on the Memorial altered.

With the clerk's research concluded, the council can make an informed decision as to how it proceeds with the request received from the family and how it wishes to proceed with the impact to it and to others created by the actions of those who disagreed with its original decision. As a significant amount of public money and time has been invested into this matter, the Council looks forward to bringing the matter to a conclusion in line with its War Memorial Policy. The work carried out by the clerk and all other documentation received relating to this matter is subject to the Freedom of Information Act and can be shared with the public and any relevant organisation that needs to see it. Anybody wishing to examine it can do so by contacting the clerk.

The Council considered grants requests received at its meeting held in November. It agreed in principal to award grants to the Outlook Magazine and the PCC for the financial year 2017/18. It would remind anybody wishing to apply in the future for a grant to ensure that the application is returned to the clerk before the closing date so that it can be included for consideration by the council.

CONCERNING SAMUEL TRIMBLE AND THE MORVAL WAR MEMORIAL

In last month's Outlook, the Parish Clerk referred to my research about possible name errors on the Morval War Memorial (I'd found two were incorrectly spelt and one was missing). Firstly, I want to congratulate her on pursuing the research I initiated, and particularly in identifying a flaw I had made in my research and her correct identification of the military records for Samuel Trimble, who was one of the three. I am happy to offer an apology to anyone, including the Parish Council, who may have been materially misled by my error.

For a period of time, I had the privilege of leading the Act of Remembrance at Morval War Memorial. For the hundredth anniversary of World War 1, I wanted to read out more than just the 11 names, and began to research them. Nine had associated military records, but Harry Saunders and Samuel Tremble didn't, although Harry Sanders and Samuel Trimble did. Harry's records showed he came from Morval, Samuel's were less detailed. Whilst doing this research, I discovered Jack Pearce Bowden's records, and that although his war grave was in Morval Churchyard, his name wasn't on the memorial.

I also managed to trace the families of all three, and spoke to them. They were happy for me to pursue my research, which was periodically presented to Morval Parish Council, who have responsibility for the upkeep of the war memorial.

- The family of Jack Pearce Bowden have requested that his name be added to the memorial. The parish council have declined to do so, but do not dispute the evidence, much of which was based on my research.
- I traced the family of Harry Sanders, and have seen the family bible presented to his mother from Sunday School, which contains a record of her immediate family and descendents including Harry. The family are still considering whether to request a name change, but there is nothing to suggest my research is wrong.
- As for Samuel Trimble, my research at the Commonwealth War Graves Commission yielded two entries for S Trimble, one was Samuel Trimble from the UK, the other for S J Trimble who was Canadian. As there was nothing to suggest a Canadian connection, I

assumed that the first record was more likely to be the correct one. This was an error; subsequent work by the parish clerk did show that the Canadian S J Trimble was from here, and the other Samuel was from elsewhere in the UK

There is, however, one over-riding fact that I believe needs to be borne in mind; surely the most important voice in all of this should be Samuel himself.

He chose to be Samuel Trimble, and as such he married, joined the military, went to war and on 21st September 1916, gave his life for the freedoms we now enjoy. In life he was Samuel Trimble, and the debt we owe him means he should be remembered as Samuel Trimble. I sincerely hope the parish council takes this into account as they discuss the request from the family for this change.
