## Maria's Story - by Annie: Part 1

Morval church is a beautiful building nestled in a small valley in the heart of Cornwall, and this little story is told by Maria, who lives in the parish;

It was Sunday morning, the air was cool, not unlike the coolness that drifts in with an oncoming tide, it gently settled around the steps that I took, while I sauntered up the old worn path, with the sparse sprinkling of grey gravel and tiny tufts of grass that had poked their defiant heads up to the light and sunshine. Many feet had passed through here, old feet, young feet, excited feet and tired, tired feet, all these had pummelled the old gravel into the earth.

But I was quite happy to come to church this morning. The birds were singing, that's always a good sign. You could hear the pheasants calling in the distance, and the sun was shining, but there was still this odd chill in the air.

As I tried to open the huge wooden door that guarded this holy building, like a faithful old soldier, it groaned and rebelled to being opened and the painted black latch, stuck slightly by being used and pushed and wiggled, and not oiled or fed with love and care.

The service was just about to start and I settled myself in a seat by myself. I looked around at all the familiar faces that I knew. They were in their usual places, chattering between themselves, like little church mice, catching up with the week's news and passing mints discretely to each other with a twinkle in their eyes, like naughty school children passing secret sweets to each other in lessons. I smiled to myself, it was much easier to sit by myself, I didn't have to think about what to say or talk about, and although I'm happy to be here, I'm extremely tired and just need peace.

Looking around you realise how beautiful it is here. Morval church is so old with so much atmosphere and antiquity, every nook and cranny holding secrets for many years, the walls have been moulded with confessions and in places they seem to ache with precious tales that might make you cry.

The wood that stretched across the eves of the roof, glowed and whispered stories that were imprinted in the bows, that sailed the oceans of times gone by, and you could almost... (cont. next page)
