### Widegates Garden Club.

After our summer break we returned to a lecture on the history of garden design. It is amazing what changes have taken place over the years, but how some elements have survived. The British have always gardened, mainly to provide food. We were very influenced by the Roman invasion when box hedges and patterns were introduced. World Wars 1 & 2 gardens were given over to producing food. Then came the famous garden landscapers introducing garden designs with trees, bridges and follies, historic gardens have been restored to this era. Sadly our new houses today have very small gardens with hard standing for the numerous family cars.

This autumn is the time to look at your garden, and if there is no room for plants do some pots to make the bees and butterflies happy. Pots can have layers of bulbs, plant daffodils half way down, put a layer of compost on top followed by a layer of tulips, further compost and finish with crocus and small iris, cover with compost and top with grit. It is also a good idea to mix grit in with the compost to aid drainage. Enjoy!

### Missed doctor's appointments can affect us all

Quay Lane Surgery has a problem, like many surgeries: the knockon effect of people missing appointments. Here's an article about...

### Missed Appointments – DNAs (did not attend) by Maggie, Patient Participation Group Vice-Chair

Behind the receptionist's desk at Quay Lane Surgery is a whiteboard showing the minutes of appointment time lost during the month when patients failed to turn up or cancel their appointment.

By sharing its DNA data with you the practice is aiming to show just how much time is being lost through missed appointments. In August 13hrs and 20 minutes Nurse time was wasted. The figure for appointments missed with our GPs amounted to almost 4 ½ hrs. This is less than previous months. Non-attendance is a major issue for the NHS increasing waiting times and costs, and wasted appointments can lead to frustration for both staff and patients.

Debbie Todd, our Practice Manager says: "The fact that some patients make appointments and then don't attend is a constant concern. A person who does not attend is blocking appointments for other patients, which is having a detrimental effect on waiting times. While there can be many reasons for patients failing to attend appointments, the most common reason is that they simply forget. The receptionists often have difficult conversations with disgruntled patients who can't get an appointment of their choice. We want to encourage patients to cancel unwanted appointments in a timely manner so that we can offer that appointment to another patient"
