Concert in St Wenna's Church, Morval at 7pm on Saturday 21st April

'Ilow Splann' translates from Cornish as 'bright/shiny/splendid music'. When Carlton Crouch and Maggie Willmott first started playing together, their main focus was a series of Cornish dance tunes which Carlton had arranged for recorder duet. Whilst this still forms a part of their repertoire, their music has evolved to include a wide range of instrumental combinations featuring recorders, saxophone, violin, guitar, bouzouki, bohran, bagpipes and keyboards, and singing. They also play music from the earliest notated forms through Renaissance and Baroque to Elizabethan dances. Carlton and Maggie particularly enjoy playing in the special atmosphere and excellent acoustic of St Wenna's. Tickets for the candlelit concert at 7pm on 21st April will be available in advance from church members or on the door, at £8 to include refreshments (Another regular aspect of an Ilow Splann concert is plenty of cake!)

So what is it all about?

If you are not a regular churchgoer, or not a churchgoer at all, but you would like to know what Christians get excited about at Easter, you are most welcome to join one of the Easter services at St Wenna's. At 2pm on Good Friday there is a quiet meditation, lasting about 40 minutes, when the story of Jesus' crucifixion is told in a series of short readings and prayers. The Easter garden will be in place, but bare. You can sit quietly and listen, or have a chat and ask questions as we share hot cross buns afterwards. The 11am Communion service on Easter Sunday is a celebration of new life in Jesus' resurrection, and the Easter garden will be alive with spring flowers. Everyone is welcome.

Looe Bowls Club

For those of you who thought that your local bowls club ceases in the winter you would be mistaken! Whilst the prevailing rain (and snow!) prevents use of the green, social events continue and these contribute significantly to our fund-raising efforts for our annually chosen charity. In November, Looe Golf Club provided the venue for our annual prize-giving, celebrating an excellent year for Looe Bowls Club, which saw numerous successes, including the Ladies Team through to the County final of the Captain's Shield, and the Men's Team winners of the East Cornwall Bowls League's Dennis Cup.

In January many members braved the squally showers to take part in a Scavenger Hunt around Looe, meeting later in the Coddy Shack for a well-earned fish supper. February's social event was a Horse Racing evening, held in the club house where we now enjoy the benefit of our own licensed bar. During the past year the club raised a total of £550 which is being donated to The Alzheimer's Society. This will be presented on Friday 23rd March to a representative from the Society when we will be holding a Coffee Morning, visitors welcome. For the forthcoming year the club's chosen charity is Guide Dogs for the Blind and we hope to equal, or better still, surpass our previous fund-raising efforts.

If you visit Hannafore regularly, you will have probably noticed the ongoing activity taking place to improve and maintain the club grounds. In 2016 the County Council granted the club a 30 year lease and much work has been undertaken to improve the site since then. Visiting Bowls Clubs always comment that Looe must have the best vista of any other Bowls Club countrywide! Being so well situated, occasionally we receive requests from the local community to use the clubhouse. As this is a community building, it is available for public hire at very competitive rates – details available on our website from the Club Secretary.

As well as the Bowling Green, we also offer Putting to the public, and once again this facility will be available for the Easter holidays and throughout the summer. An exciting new project that the club is currently exploring is the addition of a Crazy Golf Course for later this year; watch this space!

With Spring upon us, our playing members are now eagerly awaiting the arrival of the new bowls season. This will begin on Saturday 7th April at 2:00pm. Should you be interested in joining us, either as a bowler or social member, please do come along and meet our members. If you would like to try bowls free of charge, we will be holding our annual Open Day on Sunday 29th April from mid-day to 5:00pm. There will be a BBQ, tea/coffee, cakes, bric-a-brac and plenty of fun to be had.


