We are very pleased to be able to publish, over the next few editions of Outlook, some detailed recollections about our area. In the past when we have had articles about Morval, they have proved very popular, so we are delighted to be able to offer our readers...

Memories of Morval by Graham Duke

Born 15th June 1943 at 'The Dawn' nursing home at Hannafore, West Looe. My parents were Ernest Henry Duke, known as Peter, he was born on 15th May 1912 at Bethney, and Mary Louise Fenlon, known as Molly, she was born at Menheniot on18th April 1910. They married in 1941 and lived in a cottage at Tregarland. The cottage and the one next door were demolished some years ago, I'm not sure when.

In the cottage next door lived a Miss More who ran a school until 1950 to which I went until I was seven. She was also a Methodist lay preacher in the chapel at Morval.

In 1946 when I was 2 and a half we moved to No 1 Leyland Lodge, next to the War Memorial. From 1950 to 1959 I can remember who lived in Morval, Tre garland, Churchtown, Gellies and Penarthtown. My father was by 1950 the Head Gardener on Morval Estate where he had worked since 1936 after a motorbike accident on Venton Vanes corner in which he lost the use of his right arm. My mother had lived at Penarthtown with her parents until 1920 when her mother died and her two sisters. She went to Morval School, left at 14 and went to work as a house maid in Morval House. This of course was how they met. In 1950 my sister Diana Mary was born at Leyland Lodge, and I was sent out to Gran's at Trerulefoot Cottage for a week, which I thought was great. Although Gran was a country woman who would catch a chicken, cut its head off, gut it and take its feathers off, she was afraid of the dark, so she used to take me to the pictures at Polbathic Hall, walking there and back of course. I used to be a nervous wreck by the time we got home.

When Mum went to Morval House the butler was called Bert Bishop, known as 'Pop'. He was married to the cook, May. They took Mum under their wing and later they were my Godparents and

lived in St Germans after service in Morval House. Mum of course left in 1943.

In Morval House in the early 1950's were the two Miss Tremaynes, one, Miss Ellen, died in Morval House, the other moved to Steppes Lodge in one cottage next to the Bennetts who lived in the other, she later moved to a home at Marazion where she died. Miss Ellen Tremayne was looked after by a Miss Marion Lugg who was related to Bill Ough in some way. I do remember she used to host a Christmas party every year until I was 9 or 10 then they finished, so I assume Miss Tremayne died and Miss Lugg moved out.

The village hall was near the top of Gellies Hill on the right, in about 1952/3 it was decided to build a more modern village hall, today it's Pearn's boat yard, they only got the walls up and ran out of money, really it didn't get off the ground.

In the village in the 1950's next to Mum and Dad were Drs Eastleigh and family, three boys then Karl and Rita Dummer plus daughter and son next to the school. In the schoolhouse was Jim Pengelly and family of four boys, Robin, John, Lester and Clive. Robin, Lester and Clive live in Looe, John is deceased.

In the Almshouses were the gamekeeper Mr Skantlebury and his wife, next door was Mr Stan Barraball and his two sons John and Roy. John still lives in Looe, Roy I'm not sure about. When we were kids, some nights we used to follow Skantlebury through the woods noting where he laid his rabbit traps, we would then set them off or dig them up. One night I came home to find him talking to Dad who asked me if I knew anything about it. I did not of course.

In the cob cottage was Harry Billing and his wife Phil, behind was the old chapel where Mrs Rene Wind and her two daughters, Joan and Margaret lived.

In the two cottages opposite the school was Mr Len Abraham, his wife 'Abbie' and John his son, next door was Bill Reynolds and wife and two daughters Jean and Margaret and son Raymond. You will know of Raymond of course, the plumber at Nomansland. Margaret was married to Brian Berry whose elder brother Arthur farmed Longcoe, his son Tony still farms it today.

From Tudor Lodges, Morval...

Our seven, award winning three-bedroom holiday lodges are awarded Mobility 3 Independent & Mobility 3 Assisted Standards by the National Accessibly scheme, and 4 stars by Visit Britain.

The Accessible Holiday Lodges provide all facilities and equipment disabled persons have at home or in their care/nursing home. We cater for every requirement, end of life and last ever holidays. The carers involved provide a respite for family members that work hard all year and deserve a break from the stress of constant caring.

The Holiday Lodges provide much needed prosperity for the local rural economy. In the last 10 years, business rates over £70,000 (Seventy Thousand Pounds) and an approximate holiday spend of £350 per family/organisation visit. The visitor spend is in excess of £900,000 to £1,000,000. (Nine Hundred Thousand Pounds to One Million Pounds.)

Grace Community Church, our neighbours **already hold approved 2008 planning consent.** It consists of 2 storey planning permission that gives them an extra 4 new children's rooms (presumed teaching rooms) and a crèche. The extra ground floor footprint is 235 square metres. The first floor 'will be primarily for the children's worship space.'

This has not yet been built. Quote 'have not yet raised the funds to commence works' September 2013.

The **new 2018** planning application sees Grace Church extending into the Area Great of Landscape Value by approximately a further 100 square metres of floor space. The new extension will be approximately 25 metres from Tudor Holiday Lodges bedrooms.

A large elevated bridge from the first-floor function room, which will overlook our disabled bedrooms. Six large, full length one-metrewide opening windows, a double door veranda, overlooking Tudor Lodge's bedrooms.

A new Commercial Children's Play Area is located 14 metres from the bedroom of Tudor Holiday Lodges. This is for 40 plus children. This is stressful and disturbing when our holiday makers are raised on a hoist for essential nursing. There is a loss of dignity.

The provision of new shower facilities both upstairs and downstairs in the new planning application are for the use of people 'who use the church as their base during events in the summer holidays, and at other times.' Grace Church have Class D1. Usage. Non-residential usage. Design and Access statement.

The above consent, if approved would be severely detrimental to Tudor Holiday Lodges future.

It was stated on Cornwall Councils planning application site PA18/03431 that the decision date for this application was 19th July 2018. I telephoned the Cornwall planning department and was informed the decision date was 19th July 2018. I was informed that representations would be allowed up to this date.

In the last few days on the planning site the decision date has been changed to 14th June 2018.

Tudor Lodges have approached Major Disabled and Tourism Organisations for their support and stated the decision date of 19th July 2018.
