Penarthtown 1950 to 1959

In the first cottage in Penarthtown at the top of the lane was Arthur Libby, his wife and daughter Brenda (she is the same age as my sister) and his mother, I do remember Arthur getting married some time in the late 40's, I do remember his wife came from Menheniot. Arthur worked in Morval gardens with Dad and then he left to work for the county on the roads, quite a few were doing that. Next in number 2 was Jack Cox and his wife and Adrian, Jack worked for John Parsons, Morval Barton and he drove the field marshall tractor which had a very distinctive sound.

In the two council houses were the Northcots, four of them, dad worked on the farm, Raymond and Valerie. Valerie was the same age as me, Raymond was two or three years older. Next to them were Karl and Rita Dummel and their two kids, Lydia and Robert. In the late 50's they moved to No. 2 Leyland Lodge next to Mum and Dad where they stayed for a number of years before moving to Looe. Karl did work for Morval Barton and then for Looe Council, in 1989 when I started bowling at Looe Karl used to look after the bowling green for the council. Originally there were two more cottages which have since collapsed, my mother lived in one of them when her father worked at Morval Barton as a dairyman. My maternal grandmother is buried in Morval cemetery along with one baby daughter. She died of sugar diabetes when my mother was ten and the eldest of three girls.

The farmer at Morval Barton was a man called John Parsons, his wife and son Keith, the less said about Keith the better. John Parsons was a hard working farmer of the old school, he never took a holiday, rarely took a day off, although I do remember one day when Dad and I were out the front of Leyland Lodge when John Parsons came up the drive in his car, with Mrs Parsons with her fox fur stole on, he wound down the window and said to Dad "us be going to Bude", Dad just acknowledged him and off they went.

In Morval House at this time was Major Robert Kitson and Mrs Penelope Kitson, mother of his three children and a lovely lady. The children were Jessica (deceased) Juliette (in Ireland I think) and James, who you know of course. The Major's father, a Captain Kitson lived at Polrean, Sandplace, Dad used to go down twice a week to do the garden down there. There were also two Miss Tremaynes; one, Miss Ellen, died there I think and the other went to live at Steppes Lodge, Mum used to go down Saturday mornings to clean for her I remember, sometimes Di and I went, we used to walk down the drive and on past Potterfer Pond, that was always a right of way, but now I see it is blocked off from both ends. Steppes Lodge back then was two dwellings. Dick Bennet and his wife lived at number two, he did running repairs on my bike once, so I could get home. I had hit one of the granite posts with my pedal out straight, anyway Dick sorted it for me to carry on, that was in 1951 when I was nine and I had been picked to play for Looe Junior School for the first time, and a year ahead really as I was still in Miss Denise's class and not up in Mr Burnett's which came the following September. I was still in year 5 not 6 in today's system.

Of course, later Morval House was sold around 59/60 or even 64, but by the time I was at Lyneham. A couple of times I went down to Churchtown to phone camp, the Major was good that way and he also liked an update on what I was doing and where I'd been, he signed my references to join the Boy Entrants originally.

Churchtown had three dwellings. No 1 was Burt and Mrs Collings and daughter Beryl. Burt was a blacksmith, and what is a garage now was the forge, he also did a bit of farming as the blacksmith's work by the 50's was dropping off. In No. 2 was Mrs Eastleigh, her daughter (Norma), husband Eddie and their daughter Carol, married to Barry Jay who you both know. In the time of Morval House being sold, Mrs Eastleigh and the Balls moved up to No.2 Tregarland, Carol would know more about that. In No.3 was a Mr and Mrs Davey, they are both buried in Morval cemetery, I saw the headstone earlier this week and that reminded me. Later when the Major and Mrs Whiteford moved to Churchtown 1 and 2 were made into one and a Miss Brown who was Mrs Whiteford's nanny went into No. 3, she is also in the cemetery just along from Mum and Dad.

I do remember coming home from school and finding a policeman outside the front gate of Leyland Lodge, Anthony Eden was staying at Morval House recovering from an operation, I think he was in the government at the time, hence the policeman.

Vicars are always odd I think, the one when I was really young was a Reverend Saunders I think but I can't be sure. 55/56 a Mr Philips came, a younger vicar I thought with 4 daughters, one the same age as me, he started a youth club and got a cricket pitch done behind Leyland Lodge, he also had three sledges which he lent to us when the snow was down. He did not stay too long, it was a bit too quiet for him I think as he had been a prison chaplain before he came to Morval. I went to Aden in May 1963, when I came back in 1965 there was another vicar, a Revd Consella, and Italian with an Irish wife, I thought I had returned to a parallel universe. The vicar asked my sister if Mum was worried about her going to Camborne, she said no because she was too worried about my brother in Aden. They were an odd couple, no mistake, he was more an academic and she a hippy. They had one daughter, Irene, who had a thing about leaving her clothes all over the place in summer, her father used to get most upset, no-one else took any notice from what I heard.
