A message from Revd Philip Sharp:

Dear friends,

Recently I was fortunate to be able to visit RHS Rosemoor for the first time. Having been a keen gardener for most of my adult life, but in recent years tending more towards the informal 'wild' look rather than the highly manicured, 'controlled to within an inch of its life' type garden, I was really encouraged by the variety of styles planting on show. Throughout the gardens, both the formal and informal, were tips on how to encourage wildlife, especially pollinating insects, into our gardens. Along with these tips were reminders of how interlinked the whole of nature is and particularly how dependent upon other species humanity is for our general wellbeing, not to mention food production. I don't think it is a coincidence that the very first book in the Bible, Genesis, places the first humans in a garden, with the instruction to tend and care for it (the Hebrew word is also variously translated as 'subdue' or 'have dominion over' - however the word does not imply any misuse of creation) and when humanity rebels against its creator and is expelled it goes still with the instruction to steward God's creation intact. The Celtic Christians (of whom there were many in ancient Cornwall and after one in particular St Wenna's is named) understood this only too well. Their recognition of the interlinked nature of all creation and each parts interdependence upon the others has much to teach us in the way all of us should view God's creation and our individual and corporate responsibility towards its care for the generations that follow us. A timely reminder, perhaps, that the church should be at the forefront of environmental matters.

On a very different subject, please note that due to the realities of multi parish ministry, I am rarely in my office, and by far the best way to contact me is via email. These I can then answer at hours I would never consider telephoning or can arrange a convenient time to call.
