## The Morval Neighbourhood Development Plan

The idea of a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) is that Cornwall Council and the Parish Council will use it to have more say over future developments. The policies formed from the questionnaire feedback will identify what developers can or can't do.

The next questionnaire will give parishioners an opportunity to say what things they think are important concerning future developments within the parish.

Cornwall Council has a Local Plan, which runs until 2030. It states the policies that the Council will apply for new developments. Any parish can create its own NDP.

The initial work for a parish NDP is done by a group of parish volunteers called a Steering Group. They are responsible for getting evidence which forms the basis of the policies in the NDP. Without this, Cornwall Council won't adopt the NDP, but once an NDP has been adopted, it becomes legally binding until 2030.

However, certain things must be adhered to in order for an NDP to be accepted and signed off by Cornwall Council:

- It cannot contradict policies in the Cornwall Local Plan
- · it represents the views of all the parish not just a select few
- there must be parish-wide consultations
- questionnaires can't ask leading questions without evidence

The last reason is why there must be 2 questionnaires:

- 1. An initial open questionnaire inviting parishioners to say what they think are important topics within the parish.
- A detailed questionnaire based on this, where parishioners can give their opinions, sometimes rank ordering from a list or ticking what they think is important, or by answering open questions.

#### What's happens after the questionnaires are returned?

There are five stages which need to be successfully undertaken:

- 1. The questionnaire returns are used to create the Morval NDP
- 2. Cornwall Council need to assess our NDP
- 3. There is a parish consultation, so parishioners can view the drafted policies and give feedback that can be used to edit the policies before the final plan is submitted
- 4. A ballot will be held for the parishioners to approve or object to the final NDP
- 5. If a majority support it, the Morval NDP is adopted by Cornwall

### What's going to be in this detailed questionnaire?

Topics raised by parishioners in the first questionnaire and at public consultations fall into six broad categories. Here's a summary, so you can get an idea as to what you'll be asked:

#### **Section 1: Community, Heritage & Environment**

This section is where you can give your opinions about various community facilities (both current ones and potentially new ones in the future), and how they might be provided, maintained and utilised. It asks about green spaces and the natural environment, and the importance you attach to them, and also about mobile phone reception and broadband speeds.

#### **Section 2: Transport and Getting around**

This section asks about the number of vehicles in your household and the various forms of transport you use, (to give an idea of the volume of traffic the parish roads need to cope with). It asks for your thoughts and concerns about the speed and volume of traffic, parking, pathways, any visibility concerns, and your opinion about various suggested changes which might improve matters.

#### **Section 3: Employment & Enterprise**

This section asks for your opinion about various sorts of businesses that currently run in the parish, or might be set up in the future, and how they might affect parish life. There are also specific questions for anyone who runs, or is thinking of running, a business, to find out what specific requirements or concerns you may have.

#### **Section 4: Housing & Development**

This is a major section within any NDP, so getting your opinions about this topic is really important. Your opinion about how many new homes the community would like to see developed, what type of homes are built, and where they might be built is required.

#### **Section 5: Tourism**

This section asks for your opinion about the importance of tourism within the parish, and the extent to which it might be promoted.

#### Section 6: Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy

This section deals with an important topic and asks for your opinion about clean energy generation and environmental impact, and if any particular renewable energy methods should be encouraged.

## Is there any help to assist filling in the questionnaire?

Each questionnaire will be accompanied by a communications pack which has additional information to help to fill in the questionnaire.


