- Reset (www.resetuk.org): which has run a community sponsorship scheme for refugees since 2018

# MORVAL Parish Councillors heard with some frustration that improvements to the Tredinnick (Farm Shop) road junction were unlikely in the near future.

The parish's Cornwall Councillor, Armand Toms, had raised the matter with Cornwall Highways after being approached about the dangers to traffic, especially when exiting the farm shop lane on to the main Hessenford to Looe road (A387/B3253). He took up the matter with Will Glassup, Cormac Solutions Ltd's highways and environment manager, telling him many residents felt that a mirror at the junction would improve safely.

But the reply from Mr Glassup, who grew up in the local Looe area, suggested that any improvements were unlikely at this time.

Wrote Mr Glassup: 'This has always been a cautious junction and has been reported many times.

'It does not have a high accident record (no accidents reported since 2016), however visibility is reduced if you approach it wrong.

'The current policy is that mirrors should not be located within the limits of the highway as although a mirror may seem a positive help, they present a hazard to the driver passing on the main road, especially after dark when the sudden appearance of reflected headlights can cause the driver to take dangerous and unnecessary avoiding action.

'Although we do acknowledge that there are a number of mirrors located on private land across the Network we do not provide mirrors for the reasons above.'

He added: 'Any changes or enhancements to the current

signage would require funding – I would nominate this junction under the CNP HS (Community Network Panel Highways Schemes) for consideration in future years.'

Reluctantly, the Parish Council accepted the response. But the chairman said he would be interested to know the accident record of junctions with private mirrors, to see if the county's 'hazard' fears could be substantiated by facts and figures.
