Jubilee Reflections by Revd Ben Morgan Lundie

It was wonderful a few weeks ago to see our communities come together to celebrate the Queen's platinum jubilee. Before her coronation, Her Majesty said:

"I want to ask you all, whatever your religion may be, to pray for me on that day – to pray that God may give me wisdom and strength to carry out the solemn promises I shall be making, and that I may faithfully serve Him and you, all the days of my life."

That weekend e celebrated the fruits of that promise, her expressed hope in prayer to serve both God and the people of the UK and the Commonwealth. How does she do it? No doubt she has a strong personal desire and drive, but her Christian faith is the bedrock, the foundation, of her motive and source of strength and comfort.

The Queen acknowledged this very publicly in 2014 when she said this in her Christmas broadcast:

"For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, whose birth we celebrate today, is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing. Christ's example has taught me to seek to respect and value all people of whatever faith or none."

What about you – do you need strength and wisdom in your life? Just as the Queen has found a personal faith in Jesus, the invitation is open to each one of us – to become part of the supreme King's family, to be his brothers and sisters, to be called Children of God.

YOUR Parish Council does not have the final say in planning matters.

We do get consulted, and asked for our views, but ultimately the decision rests with the planning authority, Cornwall County Council.

Two applications were considered at the last meeting.

Plans for the demolition of a single-storey extension and construction of a new single-storey extension at Fairway, Widegates, were supported.

But an application for alterations and an extension to 35, Morview Road, Widegates, did not find favour.

Councillors had concerns regarding overlooking; over-development; loss of bio-diversity; loss of amenity space, and the change of appearance of the property, further out of keeping with the surrounding area and in contradiction with the proposed Neighbourhood Development Plan.

In objecting to the plan, the council

also had reservations about the water supply and drainage across the estate, which has been raised by members previously.

Both applications will now be determined by Cornwall Council.

Morval NDP update

An Independent Examiner is now assessing the Morval NDP, to check that all of the NDP regulations have been properly followed.

Once this has been done, the final stage is a parish referendum, (which has the same format as a general election, with votes being cast either in person at the polling station or submitted as a postal vote). This is when you, the Morval parishioners, will decide whether or not you wish the Morval NDP to be legally adopted by Cornwall Council.
