At St Wenna's, we are growing increasingly interested in our Celtic heritage, St Wenna herself having been one of the earliest Celtic Christians to settle in Cornwall. In recognition of this, we use Celtic liturgy in some of our services, celebrating the beauty of our surroundings and our place as stewards of the created world.

#### THE well-publicised Cornish Treehouse on the Morval Estate was among planning applications considered by the council.

The applicant, former chairman John Kitson, was seeking retrospective permission for the holiday accommodation unit.

He was allowed to address the meeting as a member of the public but once the application came up for discussion he had to declare an interest and leave the building as per the council's Standing Orders (rules).

Mr Kitson said that the structure had been built sympathetically, using sustainable materials and local labour, and it occupied a very small area of a large wood. He maintained it conformed to the relevant tourism planning policies.

Once Mr Kitson had left the room two councillors expressed their disappointment that he had not applied for permission in the traditional manner, but members were all told that they could only deal with the application on its merits, and the fact that the structure was in situ could not affect planning considerations.

The application had been supported by 18 parishioners and opposed by two, although the opponents' views were not all planning-based.

The council resolved to support the treehouse as it was in keeping with planning policies for tourism in the countryside, and they had previously backed other holiday industry proposals, such as glamping sites.

At the previous meeting an application to convert seven Tudor Lodge holiday cottages into market dwellings had been supported by



the parish council. But the county planning officer was asking councillors to reconsider since he believed their view to be contrary to the proposed Neighbourhood Development Plan.

However, the parish council disagreed and reiterated their support for the application.

As always in planning matters, the final decisions rest with Cornwall Council.
