DEBATES about the Parish Council's precept (or budget) for the forthcoming year always make for one of the most difficult meetings.

We are all facing continuing rising costs in household and living expenses.

So really, the last thing Councillors want to do is add to that financial burden by raising the Parish Council precept – the amount of money it gets from Cornwall Council to keep the parish running.

It's important to strike the right balance, just last year the Parish Council was caught out.

Councillors had decided not to raise the parish precept in previous years – despite costs going up everywhere else – only to find out that they had to put the precept up even more to get back on a level playing field and to continue delivering the same level of service.

Sometimes standing still, when prices all around you are rising, is not the best policy.

After much consideration the Parish Council figures showed it must raise its precept by 2.28 per cent, which will equate to about an extra £1.67 a year for those in the average Class D band property.

What it means in cash terms is that the Council will have a budget of £21,577.86 for the coming financial year – an increase of £728.06 on the previous 12 months.

All the Parish Council's financial accounts are on the website – www.morvalparishcouncil.org.uk – available for everyone to see.

Nothing is hidden.

The Parish Council expects to have a total income of about £24,150 (including the precept) for

the coming year but has spending plans of some £28,600 (excluding any spend on the proposed Play Area).

Much of that money has to go on maintenance, insurance, admin, website fees and other running costs. But it also includes spending on items such as noticeboards, the King's Coronation celebration, footpath signs, defibrillator maintenance, and down to much smaller items like the Remembrance Day wreath.

In addition, your Council sets aside about £1,000 each year to make donations to local organisations and projects.

These projections should leave the Parish Council with a bank balance at the end of March 2024 of some £45,000.

This has been saved over a period of time towards providing a play area in Widegates – currently some £40,000 of reserves are earmarked – but, of course, it also needs a 'rainy day' fund for emergencies or unexpected expenditure.
