

STAR OF INTEREST

In the New Year, there was a really bright 'star' in the eastern sky just after sunset. It was actually the planet Jupiter, well placed and very bright. Early January is the time of the year known as Epiphany, and traditionally remembers the visit to the baby Jesus by the Wise Men, who had been following their Star in the East. Much has been written about what the Star actually was, and why Chinese and Arabian astronomers, who were renowned observers, never recorded any reference to it in their detailed records.

Local astronomer Mike Willmott has been asked to give an illustrated presentation and talk next Christmas, giving an astronomer's view of the Star of Bethlehem. This talk will identify what the Star of Bethlehem almost certainly was. It's a story which covers several centuries, and explains exactly how the wise men would have known its identity sufficiently far in advance to give them time to make the journey, and reasons to do so
