Hello Everybody

Annual Parish Meeting: As promised in the last issue of Outlook, the Chair's report from this year's Annual Parish Meeting:

"I would like to thank all my fellow councillors for their support throughout the year. The expertise of the portfolio holders and the dedication shown has allowed the council to resolve some of the problems that have arisen

There have been some very positive moments during the last year.

The development at Shortacross is now complete providing some affordable housing within the parish. Councillor Hunt and Councillor Harding accompanied me at the invitation of Hastoe, to the official opening. We were impressed by the quality of the build. There is likely to be an application for an increase in housing adjacent to the development. Consultation continues to be on going for this and it is likely that there may be additional benefits to the parish at a future date if the second phase goes ahead.

The asset transfer of the "Village Green" to the parish remains ongoing and hopefully will come to a successful conclusion.

It was approved by the council at its last meeting that an application would be submitted to Land Registry to register a small strip of land lying between the public highway and the entrance of Trenode Lane. If this application is successful it may assist with the sale of the lane which could lead to the easing of traffic problems within the immediate area.

The council are being optimistic and are hoping that another approach to B.T. during this coming year may give success so that the land adjacent to the B.T. exchange can be developed to provide the parish with a further open area that can be enjoyed by the community.

The capping of the water well and trough within the parish field has been completed and safety fencing has been erected.

Finally I would offer thanks to the following people for their support shown to the parish during the previous year.

EJFP Planning, Chartered Town Planners 19/06/2013 – Local Housing for Local People; Consultation event for Land at Widesgates.

A Consultation event aimed at giving local residents the chance to have their say and register their interest in a scheme to provide 20 homes of which at least 15 will be much needed affordable homes for Morval Parish.

- The consultation event, on 19th June 2013, is aimed at giving residents the chance to have their say on the design of an affordable housing lead housing development.
- People are being asked what they think about the proposed scheme, which is being promoted by Trand (UK) ltd, and to register their interest in occupying one of the new affordable homes.
- The proposed development will comprise a mix of housing; 1 bed apartments, 2,3 & 4 bed houses and bungalows.
- On Wednesday 19th 2013, Trand (UK) ltd will make use of the Parish Hall in Widesgates where residents can find out more about the proposed development and give their views.
- The community exhibition takes place between 15.30 and 18.30.
