YOUR VILLAGE HALL NEEDS YOU

The Parish is very lucky to have the use of two Village Halls, the Reading Room at Widegates and the Village Hall at No-man's-land.

The Reading Room dates back to 1907.

Volunteers have worked very hard over the years applying for grants and arranging fundraising events so that now the Widegates Hall offers the following:

Kitchen: Facilities: Hot (Burco) and cold water, cooker, fridge, teapot, microwave, cutlery, crockery and work surfaces.

Car parking: Disability: entrance and accessible toilet. Darts.

Presently looking into providing more facilities due to new flooring.

Hire charges: £5 per hour. Rates inclusive (e.g. inc. heating/electric etc.) No deposit required. Hiring agreement required

The No-man's-land Village Hall was built in 1951, to celebrate the safe return of the Men of the Parish after the Second World War.

Volunteers again have applied for Grants and arranged fundraising events so that the hall can now offer: a large hall with stage, a second hall with a full size snooker table and billiards table together with a darts board.

Disabled access to the Hall and to the Toilets plus a large Car Park, and a fully fitted Kitchen.

Hire charges: £5 per hour. Rates inclusive (e.g. inc. heating/electric etc.) No deposit required. Hiring agreement required
